

Phase 1 of East Sunshine Street Corridor Project includes construction of a median from Sam's Club to Arvest Bank. This median is intended to eliminate left turns on Sunshine Street except at controlled (signaled) intersections. MoDot project engineer for East Sunshine Corridor Project expressed a preference for the median design from Highway 65 to Glenstone; indicating future improvements by MoDot on Sunshine Street might include the median design. The reason given by MoDot for the median design was safety.

MoDot states traffic count on Sunshine Street is 32,000 trips per day or 160,000 trips/5 day week or over 8,120,000 trips/year. Each trip is a potential accident. Brett Foster stated to the City Council there were 728 crashes on Sunshine Street caused by left turns from 2016 to 2020 (a four year period). 728 crashes out of a potential of 32,480,000 trips (8,120,000 X 4).

Conclusion: the median design is overly aggressive and the need not supported by traffic data. While we regret car crashes, the City nor the State should design a road system to eliminate all crashes. That design would be too costly. In addition, over 70% of the business and land owners located on Sunshine Street I have talked to (over 80 individuals), oppose eliminating left turns on Sunshine Street because of the negative impact it would have on their business or property.

I respectfully request City Council express its opposition to the median design on East Sunshine Street Corridor Project.

Dear Director McKenna:

I am writing regarding Phase 1 of the East Sunshine Street Corridor Project that proposes to construct a center median to limit the opportunity to turn left going eastbound or westbound except at designated points. I understand the goal of the new median will be to increase safety by limiting the opportunity for accidents to occur when a driver is turning left into oncoming traffic.

I appreciate and thank you for your desire to increase safety for our public roadways. However, I am concerned about the negative impact it will have on business owners due to the lack of access to their businesses and whether the cost will equate to a real increase in roadway safety on Sunshine Street. I am also concerned about the first responders who will experience response time delays due to the new median. These rippling negative impacts could hinder the Springfield community greatly.

For many years, I have traveled on Sunshine Street. My personal safety has never been a concern. I, however, cannot make that same statement for when I have traveled on MODOT-funded roads in the rural parts of our state. I have traveled on these roads frequently. During my travels, I have observed that these roads need significant repair.

I was recently traveling on a MODOT-funded road in the northern part of our state during rainy conditions where the ruts in the road caused the vehicle I was traveling in to hydroplane multiple times. It was evident the roads are in dire need of repair. When I visited with fellow Missourians who live in those areas, they let me know that they believed MODOT did not care or show any interest in getting the roads repaved. I was disappointed for them that they no longer believed their concerns were being heard because of lack of expressed interest by MODOT leadership.

I realize there are many factors to be taken into consideration when spending state and federal tax dollars for road improvements and expansions. However, I feel strongly that there are more pressing road improvement needs here in our state than the proposed project that is currently under consideration for Sunshine Street. Therefore, I oppose this project from going forward.

Though I disagree with this currently proposed project, I do want to thank you and everyone on the MODOT team for the work the team does to help keep all Missourians and all who travel on our Missouri roads safe.

The purpose of this letter is to address a growing number of concerns and questions that have recently been received by the Greene County Commission from local citizens and business owners who are worried about MoDOT's proposed access management improvements to the east Sunshine Street (Route D) transportation corridor.

In recent weeks, the County Commission has received communications from several business owners who have expressed concerns regarding the potential economic impacts that these proposed roadway improvements may present to the many businesses that are presently served by this transportation corridor. The planned elimination of numerous driveway access locations along the corridor in conjunction with a new median barrier has produced apprehensions that these actions could pose significant impediments to the consumers that support these existing businesses. Many of our concerned citizens have questioned whether or not the negative economic impacts of the proposed access management upgrades have been adequately examined alongside the stated goals of enhancing safety and improving the overall efficiency of the roadway.

We would request that some additional time be invested in the pursuit of an engineering solution that collaboratively balances the need for enhanced safety and efficiency along with the necessity of preserving the economic vitality of this important commercial transportation corridor. We believe that a practical solution can be obtained by working in coordination with local business owners to ensure that their economic concerns have been adequately addressed through the ongoing planning efforts for this project, while also providing safety improvements that will protect the roadway users throughout this corridor.

We thank you for your continued efforts to provide these much-needed transportation improvement projects and investments within the Greene County region. Please let us know if we can be of any assistance in the ongoing project coordination and discussion with local citizens.

COUNCIL BILL 2023-070 RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION

1 AFFIRMING City Council’s support for the plan of the Missouri Department of
2 Transportation (“MoDOT”) to improve sidewalks, crosswalks, and
3 intersections, repave the corridor and complete sidewalk segments, and
4 work with area businesses regarding the closure of extra access points
5 in the East Sunshine Street corridor; requesting MoDOT to suspend the
6 portion of the project that would add medians at various locations along
7 the corridor and to monitor safety data related to the East Sunshine
8 Street corridor for the next three years after making improvements the
9 City supports; and thanking MoDOT for its investment in this community
10 and in East Sunshine Street, one of Springfield’s significant commercial
11 corridors.

14 WHEREAS, in 2022, MoDOT issued the ‘Sunshine Street/Route D Safety and
15 Operational Report,’ which evaluated safety and operational conditions to determine
16 current needs and prioritize improvements on Sunshine Street/Route D from Glenstone
17 Avenue in Springfield to Farm Road 199 in Greene County; and

19 WHEREAS, based on the priorities provided in the report, MoDOT developed an
20 East Sunshine Street corridor project, which proposed signal, sidewalk (ADA),
21 intersection, and safety and operational improvements on Sunshine Street at various
22 locations between Glenstone Avenue and proposed corridor-wide improvements of
23 resurfacing and pavement markings on Sunshine Street between Glenstone Avenue
24 and Missouri Route 125; and

26 WHEREAS, the safety and operational improvements proposed include access
27 changes, including closure of access points and construction of medians at various
28 locations; and
29

30 WHEREAS, many businesses have expressed significant concern over the
31 proposed median and its impact on the economic activity along the vibrant Sunshine
32 Street corridor.

34 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
35 SPRINGFIELD, MISSOURI, as follows, that:
36

37 Section 1 – City Council affirms its support of MoDOT’s East Sunshine Street
38 corridor project improving sidewalks, crosswalks, intersections; providing resurfacing
39 and improving pavement markings; completing sidewalk segments; and working with
40 area businesses on the closure of extra access points.

41
42 Section 2 – City Council affirms its support of safety improvements to the East
43 Sunshine Street corridor, especially at signalized intersections at which 463 of 728
44 motor vehicle accidents have occurred according to the ‘Sunshine Street/Route D
45 Safety and Operational Report.’

46
47 Section 3 – City Council asks MoDOT to suspend the portion of the East
48 Sunshine Street corridor project that would add medians at various locations along the
49 corridor due to the expression of significant concerns by many businesses about the
50 impact of adding medians on the economic activity along the vibrant corridor. City
51 Council asks MoDOT to focus safety improvements on signalized intersections where
52 most accidents occur and trusts that a suitable solution can be reached by improving
53 safety at signalized intersections, reducing access points, improving crosswalks, and
54 enhancing sidewalks. In addition, City Council asks MoDOT to monitor safety data
55 related to the East Sunshine Street corridor for the next three years after making the
56 improvements the City supports to determine their impact and before considering further
57 safety modifications. City Council thanks MoDOT in advance for consideration of
58 making safety and operational improvements that do not disrupt the economic vitality of
59 this important corridor.

61 Section 4 – City Council thanks MoDOT for its continued efforts and investment
62 in our community and in East Sunshine Street, one of Springfield’s significant
63 commercial corridors.

65 Section 5 – This Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon adoption.
